As with most community colleges in California, Glendale Community College does not offer on-campus housing or dormitory facilities. Students can explore [homestays](#) or look for rentals in the local area. Rent prices can be very different depending on the apartment size and what is included. Most apartments are not furnished and require a security deposit. Some apartments can be rented month-to-month, but most will require a year-long lease.
